Who We Serve

Our highly experienced team makes MSB the sole resource in Maryland for students who are blind or low vision whose needs cannot be served at their current school. We reach students with programming on campus and with outreach programs in schools and communities across the state.

1,400 students each year

who are blind or low vision are served by MSB and 200+ students make up the on-campus student body.

96% of students

in our on-campus programs have additional intellectual, sensory, behavioral, and physical disabilities.

100% of our on-campus services are free

to students and their families through the assistance we receive from the State of Maryland. This means ALL donations directly support our students.

At MSB, we carry out our mission and foster student achievement by:

- Helping students learn and develop their skills in an accessible environment by providing modern classrooms and educational settings designed for our students and their individual needs.
- Giving students the space to be adventurous, try new things, and grow from their mistakes.
- Working directly with students to find the best ways for them to engage with their community—allowing them to feel comfortable and confident when the time comes for them to transition to life outside of MSB.

Tuition

Our preschool and kindergarten programs and fully accredited K-12 school are completely free to students thanks to the generosity of our supporters and the State of Maryland.

Out-of-School Programming

Out-of-school programming is provided statewide both on and off our campus and includes extracurricular activities, residential services, home living support, and summer programming. *Read Amaurie's story!*

Statewide Services

Statewide services allow us to work one-on-one with students in their homes and offer programs that address their specific needs. MSB also serves as the repository for braille and large print textbooks at the Maryland Instructional Resource Center (MIRC)—creating educational materials for students who are blind or low vision throughout Maryland.

Residential Program

Our residential program emphasizes activities of daily living and social skills—two main areas of our ECC—for students who live on campus, helping them learn and practice independence. *Read Nadia's story!*

Family Support and Infant and Toddler Services

These services provide guidance for families with children who are blind or low vision. Our teachers of the blind and visually impaired (TVIs) are available to meet parents in their homes, in hospitals, or any other location where they need support.


Extracurricular Activities

After eight incredible years at MSB, and working with his O&M instructor, Amaurie is able to travel independently and with ease—allowing him to engage in one of his absolute favorite activities, hiking. Amaurie has been able to explore challenging trails in MD, NY, VA, TN, KY, and WV with his family thanks to the hands-on, no-cost services at MSB.

Nadia had a close-knit friend group and a routine at her public school, but her parents knew she was still struggling to feel like an everyday kid. When she came to MSB in the 6th grade, Nadia had trouble speaking to close family members, but in the past three years, her confidence has skyrocketed. As a member of the MSB residential program, Nadia has improved her social skills and found her individuality. She loves sharing a dorm with five other students and taking turns planning after-school outings, and she spoke about the difference MSB has made in her life at a recent groundbreaking ceremony with a crowd of over 100 people!

Kimar had tried several schools before being referred to MSB to find support for her Cortical Visual Impairment (CVI).
